

Christopher L. Accola, PharmD, PA-C is a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist at the Iowa City VA Medical Center. His career in health care began in 1988 when he enlisted in the Naval Reserve as a Hospital Corpsman. He graduated with a BA in Russian in 1994 from the University of Northern Iowa and a Bachelor of Medical Science – Physician Assistant Studies from Midwestern University, Downers Grove, IL in 1997. Dr. Accola practiced as a physician assistant for 10 years in internal medicine, urgent care and family medicine, including solo practice at remote rural clinic locations. He worked for the VA at the Waterloo CBOC from 1998 to 1999. In 1999 he went on to earn certification as a Nationally Registered EMT-Paramedic. In 2000 he was commissioned in the Army Reserve Medical Specialist Corps and he was mobilized from 2003 to 2004 and again from 2006 to 2007 to provide stateside medical support. He then went on to graduate from the University of Iowa with a PharmD in 2009. From 2009 to 2013 he practiced pharmacy in Oregon where he worked in several settings: retail, retail management, anticoagulation clinic and erythropoietin stimulating agent clinic. Dr. Accola returned to Iowa and to accept a position at the VA in 2013 as an outpatient pharmacist and was appointed a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist later that year. As a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist he is assigned to the anticoagulation, medication management and internal medicine resident continuity of care (White Team) clinics. His particular interests include cardiovascular disease, pulmonary disease and general internal medicine. He is an adjunct faculty member for the University of Iowa College of Pharmacy and enjoys working with pharmacy students and residents.

Bruce Alexander, PharmD, joined the ICVAHCS in July 1976 as a Clinical Pharmacist Specialist in Psychiatry and Assistant Professor (Clinical) in the College of Pharmacy and the Department of Psychiatry, College of Medicine, The University of Iowa. He received his Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy in 1974 from Drake University and in 1976 his Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of Minnesota. His clinical work was in inpatient psychiatry with a consultative practice in outpatient mental health where he served as a preceptor for ambulatory care pharmacy residents and as a project collaborator. In the College of Pharmacy he taught senior pharmacy students on clerkship and coordinated as well as lectured in the neuropsychiatry therapeutic module for 3rd year pharmacy students. For the College of Medicine he lectured to medical students and psychiatry residents, co-coordinating a 9-month course on psychopharmacotherapeutics for the Department of Psychiatry. He taught mental health therapeutics in the College of Nursing for 10 years. He was promoted to professor (Clinical) in 1997. He was selected as Teacher of the Year in both the Colleges of Pharmacy and Medicine. Dr. Alexander retired from teaching in 2005 but still serves as a mentor to a pharmacy student. He was Board Certified in Psychiatry Pharmacy from 1998 to 2011. He is co-author of the Psychotropic Drug Handbook, which is currently in its 8th edition and has authored several book chapters along with many peer-reviewed articles. Dr. Alexander was the VA pharmacist representative to the 2004 VA/Department of Defense Posttraumatic Stress Disorder Clinical Practice Guideline Committee, where he authored the section on pharmacologic management. He has served on the Board of Trustees for the Iowa Pharmacy Association (IPA) and is immediate past Chair of the Iowa Pharmacy Recovery Network, a member of the IPA Health System Liaison Board, and a member of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy. In 2007 Dr. Alexander was selected as Iowa Health Systems Pharmacist of the Year and in 2013 as the IPA Honorary President. He served 8 years on the Iowa Medicaid Drug Utilization Committee and was reappointed to his 6th term on the Iowa Medicaid Pharmacy and Therapeutic Committee in 2015. From August 2008 to November 2011 he was the VISN 23 Mental Health Pharmacoepidemiologist, where he developed therapeutic and economic projects for the service line. In December 2011 Dr. Alexander assumed the role of Associate Chief – Clinical for Pharmacy Service. He retired from VA service on November 1, 2013. During his VA career, he served on the VA Pharmacy Benefits Management (PBM) National Drug File Committee, the National PTSD Mentoring Group, the PBM Antipsychotic Workgroup, the Office of Mental Health Services Psychopharmacology Advisory Committee, and the Advisory Board for the Mental Health Academic Detailing Initiative in VISN 21 and 22. He is now a Contract Data Manager for the National VA CRIISP and CADRE Research Programs located on the Iowa City campus. His research interests include psychotropic pharmacokinetics and PTSD pharmacotherapeutics. He currently serves on the Resident Project Advisory Board.

Tami Argo, PharmD, MS, BCCP, joined the ICVAHCS as a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist in Psychiatry in 2008. Dr. Argo received her B.A. in Biological Sciences from Northwestern University.
